ABOUT THE PROGRAM: The Warren County Recorder has the task of keeping the vital records pertaining to ownership in real estate (land) and to all encumbrances or liens upon it. Since the 1787 formation of the Northwest Territory, a Recorder’s Office has been provided in each county. Ohio became a state in 1803. Warren County was formed from Hamilton County shortly thereafter, with lands in three distinct districts – “Symmes Purchase”, “Virginia Military District” and “Congress Lands”. In addition to property records, the Recorder’s Office maintains copies of Veteran's Discharge papers (DD214) when filed by the veteran as well as Veteran Grave Registration Cards.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER: Beth Deckard worked as Deputy Recorder for eight years before being elected Recorder in 1984. In addition to her duties as Recorder, she is the administrator of the Warren County Records Center and Archives and serves on the Warren County Data Processing Board, Records Commission and Microfilm Board. She is a graduate of Kewanee High School in Indiana and attended Indiana State University.



Ms. Deckard is a member of the Ohio Records' Association and served as their President in 1994. She is also a member of the International Association of Clerks, Recorders, Election Officials and Treasurers.

Ms. Deckard has received numerous awards and honors for her service to both professional and political organizations. In addition, she has provided volunteer service and leadership to a large number of local and regional charitable organizations.

Ms. Deckard lives in Lebanon and has a daughter and son-in-law who are also Lebanon residents.
